Don't wear yourself out to get rich; stop giving your attention to it. As soon as your eyes fly to it, it disappears, for it makes wings for itself and flies like an eagle to the sky.

Proverbs 23:4-5 (HCSB)

Work. A word that may be better referred to as "the American way". A way that leaves us tired and causes us often to miss out on the joys of life. I (Bro. Shan) remember reading once this saying, "I go to work to dig the ditch to make the money to eat the bread to have the strength to dig the ditch". Now I don't know who made that statement but it sums up the lives of many quite accurately. By the time we get to the point we can't work anymore we finally stop, but by then it's too late for us to enjoy life. By then we are worn out for good. The guestion we must ask is "what am I working so hard and killing myself for?". A big house, fancy cars, nice things and in the long run do those things really matter? There are times in life when we do have to work hard just to make ends meet and keep food on the table and clothes on our families back. There are other times that maybe you could take that extra break, the half a day off, the week of vacation. We must make time for what's important and that includes both rest and being there with and for our families. We can wear ourselves out trying to get rich but it will often leave us worn out and unhappy. I don't know that there has ever been anyone on their deathbed who said "I wish I had worked more just a few hundred more hours" or "I wish I had made just a little more money". Most realize at the end of life that they wished they would have spent more time with family and more time enjoying life. Proverbs 23 is a good reminder that riches will leave us tired and unhappy so don't fall into the trap! Don't be the one that looks back on life with regret of time wasted and a bank account full of money that can't buy happiness. Work when it's time to work, rest when it's time to rest, and play when it's time to play and enjoy life with the Lord who gave it to you and with those He put around you.
