Jamie's Bread Pudding

Prep: 10 Minutes

Level: Easy

Cook: 60 Minutes

Serves: 12-15

Ingredients

- 1½ - 2 Loaves of Bread
- 1 Quart of Milk
- 3 Large Eggs
- 1 Stick of Butter
- 1 Teaspoon of Vanilla
- 2 Cups of Sugar
- Cinnamon/Sugar Mixture

Preparation

Break bread into pieces, layer in 9x13 pan. Melt butter, add sugar, eggs, vanilla, and milk. Pour over bread. Sprinkle lightly with cinnamon/sugar mixture. Bake @ 350 for 1 hour and let cool.

Ingredients

- 1 Stick of Butter
- 12oz Bag of White Chocolate Morsels
- 1 Cup of Powdered Sugar
- 6 Teaspoons of Water
- ½ Teaspoon of Vanilla

Melt butter and morsels. Add powdered sugar, water, and vanilla. Pour over bread pudding and enjoy!

IN THE WORD

11 “I have spoken these things to you so that My joy may be in you and your joy may be complete. **12** This is My command: Love one another as I have loved you. **13** No one has greater love than this, that someone would lay down his life for his friends.

John 15:11-13

Joy. I suppose my greatest lesson on joy came from my 5th grade teacher Mrs. Blalock. Of course that was at a time when you could teach a child about Jesus without fear of being fired and many kids would be better off today should they be so fortunate to have a good Christian teacher in their lives. Her remarkably simple explanation of joy captured my attention because she helped me to be able to understand it and be able to apply to my life. If we want to find joy in your life she said, you must put **J**esus first, **O**thers second, and **Y**ourself last. This acrostic, while simple, quite nicely sums up what scripture commands of us. Jesus is commanding His disciples to stay rooted in Him in John 15. Should they love Him and love others the way He loved them they would have the joy He was speaking of.

Proverbs 17:22 tells us “A joyful heart is good medicine, but a broken spirit dries up the bones.” That is undeniably true. When there is joy in our life all is well. The question is how do we obtain Joy and thankfully Jesus gives us the answer in **John 15**. So if we are lacking joy in our lives it may be because we are not firmly rooted in the source of joy, Jesus. **Matthew 22:37** and **Philippians 2:3** are good reminders to us to Love the Lord with all our heart and consider others as more important than yourself. When we do that we will experience the joy Jesus wants us to have.
