#### Homemade Cinnamon Rolls

Difficulty: Easy

Serves: 6 people

Prep: 25 min. Cook: 20-30 min.

- Ingredients • DOUGH
- 1 cup warm (not hot) milk
- 1 tablespoon instant yeast
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons butter, soft
- 2 small eggs
- 3 cups flour
- FILLING
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons cinnamon
- GLAZE
- Combine powdered sugar, milk and vanilla extract to your desired consistency

#### Preparation

- 1. Using a dough hook in a stand mixer, combine the warm milk, yeast, sugar, salt, butter, and egg on low.
- 2. Slowly add in flour.
- 3. Once the flour is incorporated, turn mixer to medium speed.
- 4. Add more flour if necessary. The dough should be soft and sticky but pull away from the side of bowl.
- 5. Transfer dough to a large lightly greased mixing bowl, cover, and let rise for 1 hour.
- 6. Grease a 9x13 baking pan.
- 7. Roll dough out to a 12x18 inch rectangle.
- 8. Brush the dough with the ¼ cup melted butter from the filling.
- 9. In a small bowl, combine the brown sugar and cinnamon.
- 10. Sprinkle mixture over buttered dough.
- 11. Roll up tightly lengthwise to make one long roll.
- 12. Use thread to cut dough into 12 (one inch) slices.
- 13. Place slices into greased pan.
- 14. Cover and let rise for about 45 minutes.
- 15. Preheat oven to 325 degrees.
- 16. Bake rolls for 20-30 minutes or till brown. (Time will depend on how hot and even your oven bakes.)
- 17. After pulling rolls out of the oven add glaze. (Recipe from the kitchen of chef Michelle)
