Michelle's Mac & Cheese

Prep: 20 Minutes

Level: Easy

Cook: 25 Minutes

Serves: 10

Ingredients

- 1lb Medium Shells
- 3 Tablespoons Butter
- 2 Tablespoons Flour
- 2 ½ Cups Half and Half
- 1 Cup of Evaporated Milk
- 4 oz Cream Cheese (Softened)
- 1 Cup Sharp Cheddar Cheese (Shredded)
- 2 Cups Cheeses of Choice (Shredded)
- Salt and Pepper to Taste

Preparation

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
2. Bring a large stock pot of water to a boil.
3. Add salt into water.
4. Stir in pasta and cook until al dente.
5. Drain pasta (Do NOT rinse with water!)
6. Stir in 1 tablespoon of butter and cover.
7. Melt remaining butter in a sauce pan.
8. Whisk the flour into butter for 1 minute.
9. Slowly pour in half and half while whisking.
10. Add in cream cheese and stir until dissolved.
11. Season to taste with salt and pepper.
12. Add in ½ cup of each cheese.
13. Once cheese begins to melt turn off burner.
14. Pour cheese mixture over pasta, and stir.
15. Stir in evaporated milk.
16. Taste and add salt as needed.
17. Pour ½ of mixture into buttered dish.
18. Top evenly with ½ of remaining cheese.
19. Add remaining mixture and top with cheese.
20. Bake uncovered for 25 mins or until brown.
21. Allow to rest for 10 minutes before serving.

* The dish I bring to church is a double recipe.



“He must increase, but I must decrease.”

John 3:30

There is a wonderful truth in these seven words. A truth that will change us if we should have the same heart that John had when he said these words. In this passage (**John 3:22-30**) John's disciples came to him because people were flocking to Jesus and not to John. John however is not offended by this, but instead rejoices over it. John had no intention or desire of thinking himself more important than he was. Instead he knew his purpose was to point people to the Messiah and he was pleased to see that Jesus had come. John was simply the Lord's servant pointing people to Him and keeping attention from himself. John knew that anything Jesus was going to do was far greater than anything he could do. John was ready to put Jesus above everything he was doing. That I believe, is a good lesson for us. We may easily get caught up in what our plans are and what control we may think we have in our lives. We may think to much about what we want and what others think of us, that we lose track of doing what God wants us to do regardless of what others may think. John wasn't concerned about being in the spotlight, he was concerned with seeing that Jesus increased in his life and the life of others. Perhaps today you realize Jesus needs to increase in your life. Jesus doesn't just need to be part of your life, He needs to be the most important part of your life. As we draw closer to Jesus and value Him more and more, the things we used to value in our lives begin to decrease. Our worldly desires begin to go away and our desire to serve Jesus begins to increase. Let us be ready to decrease so that Jesus can increase in our lives.

Fabulous Flowers

You may have noticed the red begonias in the church flower bed that replaced the yellow marigolds. The begonias were better in that part sun/shade. Marigolds need more sun. The bed is watered daily for 2 hours by drip hoses. Pine bark mulch helps retain the moisture and deter weeds.

Low-growing begonias are great in beds because they don't need dead-heading (pinching off the dead flowers). They need moderate moisture and bloom until heavy freezes, when they will die. Potted begonias can bloom inside all year with bright indirect light, warmth, and fertilizer. They come in various heights and leaf shapes, like “angel wing” and “dragon wing.” Blooms range from white, pink, red, to coral.
