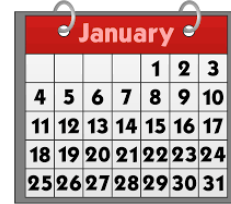

Amazing Dinner Rolls

Prep: 180 min. Difficulty: Medium
Cook: 15-19 min. Serves: 20 people

Ingredients

- ½ Cup of Warm Water (110-115 Degrees)
- 2 ¼ tsp Active Dry Yeast
- ⅓ Cup + ¼ tsp of Granulated Sugar
- 1 ⅓ Cups of Warmed Whole Milk
- ¾ Cup of Salted Butter (Divided) (At Room Temperature)
- 1 Large Egg (At Room Temperature)
- 1 ½ tsp Salt
- 4 ½ Cups of All-Purpose Flour

Preparation

1. Measure out warm water and stir in yeast and ¼ tsp of sugar. Whisk and let rest for 5-10 minutes until mixture is foamy.
2. Pour mixture into a mixing bowl adding in ⅓ cup of sugar, warm milk, 5 Tbsp of butter, egg and salt. Use electric mixer to blend mixture until combined. Add in 2 cups of flour and mix until well combined.
3. Using the dough hook attachment with the mixer, mix on low speed, slowly add remaining 2 ½ cups of flour and mix until dough is smooth and elastic (4-5 minutes). Dough should be slightly sticky to the touch.
4. Transfer dough to a greased, large mixing bowl and cover bowl with plastic wrap. Allow dough to rise in a warm place until it doubles in size (approximately 1 ½ hours).
5. After dough has risen, divide into two portions. Shape each into a ball and roll each out into a 13 inch circle on a floured surface. Spread each circle with 2 Tbsp of butter. Cut each circle into 4 equal quarters, then cut each quarter into three wedges (like a little pizza slice). Roll up all of the small wedges starting with the wide end of each.
6. Transfer rolls to a buttered 10x15 inch cookie sheet (the tip of each rolled wedge should be tucked on the bottom). You can fit 3 rows of 8 rolls in the pan. Cover rolls loosely with plastic wrap and let rise in a warm place until they double in size (about 1 hour).
7. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Remove plastic from rolls and bake for 15-19 minutes until golden brown. Remove from oven and brush with remaining 3 Tbsp of butter.

Proverbs 11:24

If I was forced to choose only one book of the Bible to be able to read for the rest of my life it would be the book of Proverbs. It is chock full of wisdom ALL of which I need to hear. I find myself returning to the Proverbs often and each time realizing I have a long way to go in my pursuit of wisdom. As I read through each chapter of the book almost every theme I come across speaks to my need to grow in that area. It helps remind me how far I have left to grow in the Lord and in my daily walk with Him. Recently I have begun reading through Proverbs again and as I read through Proverbs 11 last night I was forced to think about wealth and generosity and inevitably reflect on my own life. As I look through this proverb again this morning I am reminded of the struggle that wealth brings. Do I freely give enough? Do I trust to much in what I have, whether a little or a lot? If I lost it all today would it cause me to trust the Lord more or would I begin to trust Him less? Perhaps you have struggled with these questions as well and know the burden that wealth often brings with it. We should see clearly through scripture that wealth can lead to ruin should we begin to trust in it too much. Of course knowing that and living that out are two different things. In verse 28 of Proverbs 11 it says, *“Anyone trusting in riches will fall, but the righteous will flourish like foliage.”* I don’t know about you, but I certainly want to flourish and not fall. That is why I like the proverbs so much. They remind me of truths like these. While we may be tempted to trust wealth, the Bible reminds us to trust the Lord. If we are trusting in anything other than Jesus and what He did for us on the cross, we are trusting in the wrong thing.
